Nigeria leads in polio fight progress

The incidence of polio in Nigeria dropped by more than 50 percent in 2009 to 388 cases, compared with 783 cases for the same period in 2008.

Most dramatic was the decline in the transmission of the type 1 wild poliovirus, to 74 cases from 707. Also, the proportion of unimmunized children in Nigeria's highest-risk states fell below 10 percent for the first time.

The World Health Organization's Advisory Committee on Polio Eradication attributes 95 percent of the world's progress

against the disease in 2009 to Nigeria's success. Rotarians are playing a key role.

"There is a big momentum, much more than ever before, of the federal government, more state governments, and traditional leaders, as well as some local governments, to mobilize all the needed forces," says Busuyi Onabolu, chair of the Nigeria PolioPlus Committee. The effort aims to ensure "that the required quality of the campaigns is regularly implemented and every child is immunized with the potent (vaccine) drops."
