Mississippi Public Safety Commissioner

Stephen B. Simpson was appointed in 2008 by Gov. Haley Barbour to serve as Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Public Safety.

After receiving his Bachelor of Science (1980) and Master's Degree (1981) from Delta State University, Stephen was employed as Probation and Parole Officer for the Mississippi Department of Corrections. He earned his Juris Doctorate degree from The University of Mississippi in 1988.

After law school, Stephen

practiced law with his brother, James C. Simpson Jr., and later served as an Assistant District Attorney for Harrison, Hancock, and Stone Counties. In December 2000, Stephen was appointed by Governor Ronnie Musgrove to serve as a Circuit Court Judge for the Second Circuit Court which included Harrison, Hancock, and Stone Counties.

Stephen lives in Gulfport with his wife Elizabeth and three daughters Erin, Kameron, and Britton.

Camp kicks off India immunizations

A free health camp in New Delhi helped set the stage for India's January 10 National Immunization Day (NID).

Organized on January 7 by the Rotary Club of Delhi South Metropolitan, Delhi, with support from the India PolioPlus Committee, the camp provided underprivileged residents with checkups, consultations, and information on a wide range of health issues.

Health camps are often held

before NIDs in India to encourage people to participate in polio immunization activities. Rajashree Birla, an honorary member of the Rotary clubs of Bombay and Mulund, Maharashtra, joined Lakshmi Mittal, who leads ArcelorMittal, the world's largest steelmaker, and his wife, Usha, in inaugurating the New Delhi camp. Birla and the Mittals are major contributors to Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge.
