Norma Deering is president and director of Sisters Network, an organization she's been associated with since 2005. Sisters Network's Tupelo Chapter was established in 2003, and the national organization was founded in 1994 by Karen E. Jackson in Houston, Texas. The organization is committed to increasing local and national attention to the devastating impact breast cancer has in the African American community.

Sisters Network has 43 chap-

ters in the United States, and the Tupelo chapter is the only one in Mississippi.

Deering is a native of Smithville. She attended Smithville High school and Itawamba Community College. She has worked in retail for more than 14 years as a store manager, personnel manager, zone manager and training coordinator.

In April 2005 she was diagnosed with breast cancer. She has been in remission for more than 4 years.
