Retired from the United States Army

Retired Army Col. Larry Mims, of Tupelo, served in Vietnam and during Operation Desert Storm. He will be speaking today on Employer Support of the Department of Defense.

Employer Support for the Guard and Reserve (ESGR) is a Department of Defense organization.

The nation's Reserve components (referring to the total of all National Guard members and Reserve forces from all branches of the military) comprise approximately 46 percent of our

total available military manpower. The current National Defense Strategy indicates that the National Guard and Reserve will be full partners in the fully integrated Total Force.

ESGR was established in 1972 to promote cooperation and understanding between Reserve component members and their civilian employers and to assist in the resolution of conflicts arising from an employee's military commitment. It is the lead DoD organization for this mission.
