United States leads all nations in support for ending polio worldwide

For more than 20 years, the United States has been the leading public-sector supporter of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, contributing more than \$1.6 billion — about a quarter of all funding.

A major component of the country's support is the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), including more than \$101 million in funding for the agency in 2009. Along with the World Health Organization, Rotary

International, and UNICEF, the CDC is one of the spearheading partners of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, providing support such as use of its Atlanta, Georgia, laboratories as a global reference and training center and strong support for the worldwide network of 145 polio laboratories

The highly developed lab network, established as part of the end-polio initiative, is also being used to track measles, rubella, yellow fever, meningitis, and other deadly infectious diseases.
