DEAN HANCOCK

Dean Hancock is President of the Health Care Foundation of North Mississippi, and Vice President of North Mississippi Health Services. In these roles he is responsible for all charitable fund programs and activities for the North Mississippi Medical Center system. He oversees such things as major gifts, annual giving, special events, grant writing and research, and government appropriations. Additionally, he is administrator of HealthWorks!, a \$6 million interactive children's health education center for students in grades K-8. The center opened in late 2008 in the former Kroger location adjacent to Gloster Creek Village in Tupelo.

Prior to joining NMHS, Hancock served as vice president of the Baptist Health Foundation in Birmingham, Ala., from 1988-1998, and had worked with the Boy Scouts of America in Alabama, Mississippi, and Texas.

He is a member of the National Society of Fund Raising Professionals, CFRE, and the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy, CFRE.

He earned a bachelor of science degree from Delta State University. Originally from Baldwyn, he is married to Betty, and they have two children; Jon-Jon and Katie.

DONNA LODEN

Donna Green Loden serves as Imaginator of Awesome Experiences at

HealthWorks! in Tupelo. In this position, she is the education coordinator, collaborating with HealthWorks! staff to create and implement health education programs; design and prepare scripts, props and curriculum materials; provide special programs and events for the community; and assist in coaching all health education faculty.

Donna's background is in education, having spent 33 years teaching in the public school system. Prior to coming to HealthWorks! she taught reading, English and spelling at Thomas Street Elementary. She was also the media specialist there, maintaining the library of 14,000+ books, videos, professional and reference materials, and 150 computers and the computer lab. She also help set up an maintain the accelerated reading, accelerated math, accelerated grammar and spelling, STAR and STAR Early Literacy, Orchard, Concourse and BookTracks databases. She was a Teacher of Distinction and Thomas Street Teacher of the Year in 2006, and also was runner-up for the honor of Tupelo public School District Teach of the Year that year. She was Mississippi PTA Educator of the Year in 2003.

She received her bachelors and masters degrees in elementary education at Mississippi State University, and AAA degree and add-on certification in library science at Ole Miss.

She is married to Duke Loden, and they have one son, Reed.
