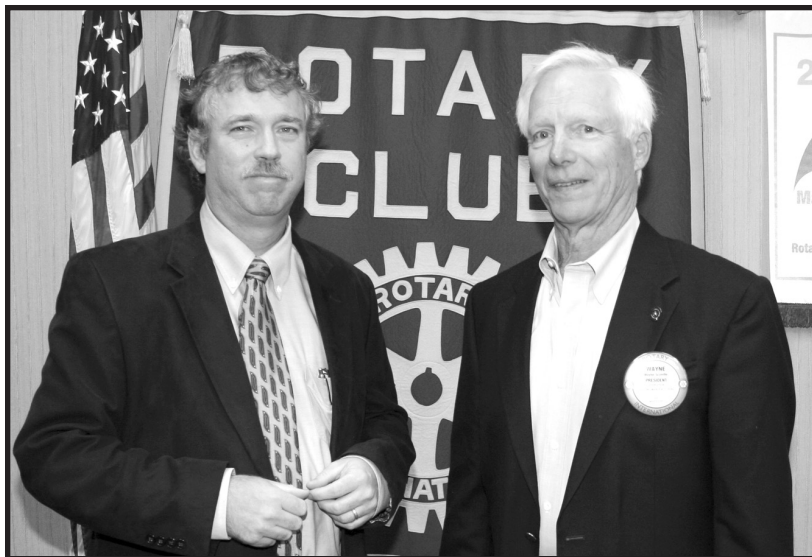

Alice Clark

Vice Chancellor of Research, The University of Mississippi

Dr. Alice Clark currently serves as Vice Chancellor for Research and Sponsored Programs at The University of Mississippi, a Carnegie-designated research extensive university.

As the institution's chief research officer, she oversees the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs, which is responsible for facilitating and coordinating the acquisition and administration of fiscal resources and the development of infrastructure for conducting research and scholarly

activities. In this capacity, Dr. Clark is the University's chief liaison with federal offices.

She holds a faculty appointment in the School of Pharmacy, and in 1993 was named a Frederick A.P. Barnard Distinguished Professor of Pharmacognosy for her research efforts in discovering and developing pharmaceuticals from natural sources.

Dr. Clark received her B.S. in Microbiology from Troy State University and her M.S. and Ph.D. in Pharmacognosy from Ole Miss.

RI president notes Rotary-U.N. efforts

RI President Dong Kurn Lee praised the 20-year partnership between Rotary and the United Nations in fighting polio during a recent forum convened by UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon.

At the forum in New York, attended by top government and civic leaders, Lee reaffirmed Rotary's commitment to working with the UN to eradicate polio and build a healthier, more peaceful world.

"We have brought the world closer to the end of a disease and to

the achievement of the fourth Millennium Development Goal: reducing child mortality," Lee said during a session on health and education. "We have created partnerships that will endure and will yield benefits far beyond the elimination of one disease."

Lee and other RI leaders spent four days in New York in September participating in several forums, convened to assess progress made toward achieving the Millennium Development Goals adopted by world leaders in 2000.
