Park. A former school teacher and stay-at-home mom, in 1983 under Chancellor Porter Fortune she became the first Ole Miss Regional Admissions Counselor serving south Mississippi and a four state region.

She is married to current State Parole Board member Danny Guice, Jr. They have two adult sons, Danny III and Nicholas, both of Ocean Springs.

Rotarians can help feed the hungry

Throughout the world and right here at home there are people going hungry. Here in Northeast Mississippi food pantries are in vital need of more food items to try and meet the demand of people in need.

The Boy Scouts of America recognized this need and established a program called Scouting for Food. Last year, during the Reed's Christmas Parade, each person participating, as well as those watching the parade, was asked to bring a can of food.

The Boy Scouts are continu-

ing the program this year and have added a new twist by asking several schools, civic organizations, businesses, etc. to participate by designating a certain time period to collect can goods. When all the food is collected, a Boy Scouts representative will pick up the items. All the food collected will go to the Salvation Army where it will be distributed to local food pantries.
