**Thad Cochran**

*The senior Senator of the State of Mississippi*

Thad Cochran is the senior United States Senator from the State of Mississippi.

He was elected to the Senate in 1978 and has been re-elected with landslide margins four times. He is the Ranking Member of the Senate Appropriations Committee and the Homeland Security Appropriations Subcommittee. He also serves as a member of the Agriculture and Rules Committees of the Senate.

He is a member of the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Naval Academy and the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution; and he

has received the lifetime achievement award of The Nature Conservancy.

Before his election to Congress in 1972, Senator Cochran practiced law in Jackson, and he served as an officer in the U.S. Navy. He earned his undergraduate and law degrees from Ole Miss. He studied international law for a year under a Rotary Foundation Fellowship at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland, and he has been awarded honorary degrees from five other colleges and universities.

He and his wife, Rose, have two children and three grandchildren.
